Permit Term: Up to TWO years. Permits are \$100.00 per boat / per year and valid through June 15 of the second year of issuance. For example, a permit issued August 15, will be valid for one year and 10 months.

This permit does not grant any reservation or rights of exclusive use, nor does it imply any permanent interest or rights to future use and is revocable at will. The State of Alaska will not be responsible for any theft, vandalism, acts of nature, or any other damage or loss to personal property stored under this permit. Boat storage policies are currently under review and may be amended at any time. Compliance with all other state regulations is required. This office will notify the area ranger of your permit. Long-Term Boat Storage

Permits are required for the long-term storage or moorage of private boats on park lands or lakes that are NOT adjacent to an owner's private property; and for a time period in excess of 72 hours. Boats kept adjacent to private upland properties do not require a permit. Permits for long-term storage and moorage of boats on park lands or waters are subject to revision and will not be finalized until the Nancy Lake State Recreation Area Management Plan Revision has been adopted.

Raft-barges

Raft-barges are defined as floating dock-like structures, either motorized or non-motorized, that are not permanently affixed in any location, and are primarily used to transport small vehicles such as Off-Highway Vehicles (OHVs), equipment, or supplies that otherwise would not fit in a conventional boat across water. Raft-barges are typically too large and heavy to remove from the water after each use. Other than the EIGHT barges previously authorized in 2009, no further barges will be authorized on Butterfly Lake.

Special Stipulations

- 1 Permit Decal Required: The Division of Parks and Outdoor Recreation (DPOR) will issue a decal for each boat permitted for long-term storage or moorage. The decal must be affixed near or adjacent to the US Coast Guard AK Boat Registration number. For boats not requiring AK registration, the decal must be permanently attached to the forward right bow just below the gunnel or deck of the vessel. The decal must be plainly visible from the exterior of the boat.
- 2 Fuel Cache Limitation: Fuel storage shall only be allowed for immediate use of a motorized boat on-site. **No more than FIVE gallons of fuel may be stored per vessel per permit.**
- 3 Boat Fuel Storage: All gas containers shall be metal, approved for marine use with a maximum capacity of FIVE gallons and shall be clearly marked with the owners name and boat permit number (not AK boat registration number). Gasoline hoses may not be left attached between the container and the engine where wildlife could damage and cause leakage. Portable fuel containers are not allowed to be stored on open raft-barge decks. However, they can be contained in a secondary enclosure such as a hard-sided tool box that is resistant to wildlife damage. This restriction includes hoses, tubes or any other fuel-containing apparatus.
- 4 On-Land Fuel Storage: Gas containers as described above may be stored under an overturned boat.
- 5 Personal Equipment Limitation: Each boat permit has the option of having one metal storage box (see below), one fuel container, oars, paddles, engine, battery (for electric trolling motors) and personal flotation devices. Small boats may also store this equipment under the overturned boat.
- 6 Storage Lockers, Barrels, Boxes, etc.: Each boat may have one metal box/locker with a volume no greater than 16 cubic feet (a 55 gallon sealable drum is acceptable) that can be used to secure the above personal equipment and placed under the boat. Oars or paddles too long to fit may be placed under an overturned boat. Containers must be of a neutral/natural color, and display the permittee's name and permit number. All other larger storage containers must be replaced unless they were in place in 2013. Non-conforming containers must be brought into compliance by June 16, 2016. No containers may be attached to trees.

- 7 Preservatives: The wooden portions of any boats shall not be treated with any preservative containing pentachlorophenol or creosote. Wood preservatives must be pre-applied using pressure treatment rather than painted on or allowed to soak into the wood.
- 8 Flotation Materials: Raft flotation shall be of materials which will not become waterlogged or sink when punctured. Closed cell (extruded) expanded polystyrene or equivalent material of good quality and manufactured for marine use is recommended. Lesser quality foam bead flotation may be authorized if it is encased in a protective coating to prevent deterioration with resultant loss of beads. Existing foam bead flotation will be allowed unless it is breaking up into the water, at which time it no longer complies with the stipulations of this permit and must be removed. No unexposed foam flotation will be authorized in any future raft upgrades.
- 9 Designated Storage Locations: Boats stored on park uplands may only be placed in designated locations. DPOR will install signage to define the area. Boats moored may not impede transit through traditional lake access points and measures must be taken to not to trample or damage riparian zones.

For Butterfly Lake ONLY – Boat moorage against park uplands at the Butterfly Lake Trail terminus will be allowed to continue, but may not impede transport of stored boats to water, nor may they constitute an impediment to navigation on the lake. The shoreline and riparian zone to the south of the main shore landing will be closed to overland passage. Temporary fencing will be placed to prevent access through this zone to allow habitat restoration to occur. No lines or tethers may attach boats to upland vegetation. DPOR will provide further guidance in this regard once the snow and ice have melted and assessments can be made. Other permanent moorings will not be allowed unless specifically authorized by park officials. Boat loading or off-loading may only be performed at the designated launch location.

- 10 Boat Size Limitation: To protect shorelines, the maximum length of a stored, moored or anchored boat will not exceed 16 feet in length or 10 feet in width except for canoes which cannot exceed 20 feet. **For Butterfly Lake**, existing raft-barges may not be altered or rebuilt larger than what existed on June 5, 2009.
- 11 Revocation: Permittee understands that this permit is revocable at the will of the State of Alaska. Furthermore, failure to comply with permit stipulations may also incur citations and possible impoundment of personal property.
- 12 Permit Availability: Storage permits under this determination are available to anyone that applies and can comply with the stipulations.
- 13 Assignment: Permits may not be assigned or transferred and permittee shall not sublet or enter into third party agreements involving the privileges authorized by this permit.
- 14 Fees: Each permit has a \$50.00 non-refundable permit fee per boat.
- 15 Multiple Boats: Each boat requires a separate permit. No person may have more than two permits per term.
- 16 Boat Storage Capacity: DPOR will evaluate the designated storage areas on an annual basis and if it is determined that capacity is reached or that impacts to park resources are unacceptable, future authorizations may be limited or permit stipulations may be revised.
- 17 Active Use of Permit Privileges: A permit may be subject to revocation if a permittee do not actively utilize it.

- 18 Abandoned, Hazardous, or Derelict Boats: Permitted boats that are obviously not being used, in disrepair, no longer serviceable, or pose a hazard to the public or pollution, are subject to impoundment and permit revocation.
- 19 Damage Liability: The permittee shall protect the land and waters, property, and resources of the State of Alaska from damage in the area covered by and used in connection with this permit. The permittee shall be liable to the state for any damage resulting from negligence or from the violation of the terms of this permit or any law or regulation applicable to the use of state parks or other state lands by the permittee or by the permittee's agents.
- 20 Security Recommendation: Permittees are encouraged to adequately secure all valuables covered under this permit. DPOR assumes no responsibility in the loss, damage or theft of personal property stored on park lands or waters. *(Red Shirt Lake has a steel cable for stored boats)*
- 21 Public Access: Stored boats shall not interfere with free public use of park trails, waters, or public access easements in the area.
- 22 Failure to Comply: Permittee agrees to comply with the terms of this authorization. Failure to do so shall be considered a violation of park regulations and may result in citation AND impoundment of boats or rafts at the owners expense.
